At SCRIPT, we draw on an unparalleled breadth and depth of international, interdisciplinary academic and applied research across a multitude of sectors, from food security and health futures, through to education, finance and manufacturing.

We're working with the world-renowned **Murdoch University Asia Research Centre** to identify the impact of politics and productivity policy on SMEs in Singapore.

We're also combining and applying research from a number of our international university partners, including the University of Exeter in the UK and FAU Erlangen-Nurnberg in Germany, HHL Leipzig.

And we're engaged in some of the most exciting and revealing productivity research programs in the world.

For example, there's our recent investigation into the falling productivity levels\* of Singapore's small and medium sized firms (SMEs), which involved building a dynamic web portal that enables ongoing benchmarking and comparison. Then there's our pioneering research into the increasingly important issue of food security, which follows on from the independent international inquiry undertaken through the Second Murdoch Commission.


